2018 Road Projects: **Chippewa Drive (between Dwight Street & East Chippewa Drive)** – This project is slated to begin as soon as road weight restrictions are lifted, in Osceola County. Mecosta County has given the contractor a waiver to move the equipment through Mecosta County. This could be as early as the week of April 16<sup>th</sup>. The project is estimated to be a two-month project for completion. However, things can change during the construction period. This is an extensive project and will be an inconvenience to many people and property owners. The Township Board is asking for your patience.

90<sup>th</sup> Avenue (between 20 Mile & 19 Mile) Safety Project – This project will consist of a hill cut, sag filled, guard rail, paving etc.... The project will include the entire mile of road, between 19 Mile and 20 Mile Roads.

23 Mile Road (between 120<sup>th</sup> & 105<sup>th</sup> Ave) – This is a cost share project with the Mecosta County Road Commission. The 1 ½ Mile Project consists of "wedge and overlay". Additional future overlay projects, on 23 Mile Road, in Chippewa Township, will continue in 2019.

#### **CEMETERY NEWS**

The Township will be doing Spring Clean-Up at the four Cemeteries, as soon as weather permits. Please remove any items, you wish to keep, from your loved ones grave site. **Also, remember that all artificial flowers must be in an approved container**. This allows the Cemetery Sexton to be able to weed whip around the headstones. Artificial flowers not in a container will be removed. The Chippewa Township Cemetery Ordinance is located on the Township's website, for reference. In the past we have noticed that old artificial flowers, plastic containers, wreaths etc. have been just thrown into the wooded area of Chippewa Cemetery and also across the road in the ditch at Church Cemetery. The Township installed trash receptacles in each of the 4 cemeteries. If for some reason the trash can is missing, please take these items with you to dispose of. It would be greatly appreciated not only by the Board members and Cemetery Sexton who clean-up the cemeteries each year, but also the adjoining property owners.
