Due to scheduling conflicts, there will only be 1 Township Clean-Up Day this year


The Chippewa Township Clean-up Day will be Saturday, July 30th from 8 a.m. - 10 a.m. or until dumpsters are full. The location is the Chippewa Township Community Center located at 10467 19 Mile Road. Township Officials will NOT be helping unload trash. You are responsible for unloading ALL of your trash in a timely manner to help keep the flow going smoothly!! Township Officials will be on-site to direct traffic and oversee drop offs. Only One vehicle unloading at a time so prepare for traffic backups! Please remember that all loose trash must be cut into manageable pieces or placed in trash bags and please bring help to unload large & heavy items. Due to past problems, each property owner is limited to (1) pickup and (1) trailer load. NO building materials. If you are doing any building or remodeling, please rent your own dumpster. This service is provided, free of charge, to the property owners & residents of Chippewa Township only! ***NO EARLY DROP OFFS & NO TIRES ***

Please remember that <u>ALL</u> artificial flowers must be in an approved container. This allows the Cemetery Sexton to be able to weed whip around the headstones. All Artificial flowers and trinkets not in a container will **be removed**. The Chippewa Township Cemetery Ordinance is located on the Township's website, for reference. Go to www.chippewatwp.org, click on the "Community" tab then click on "Cemeteries". All of the Chippewa Township Cemeteries are closed to vehicle traffic in Winter months when there is snow on the ground. **PLEASE** do not drive into the cemeteries when there is snow on the ground, this includes ALL types of vehicles. Reminder: The week of May 1, 2022 the cemeteries will be cleaned. All artificial flowers that are not in approved containers, faded, etc., and all broken graveside ornaments will be throw away. PLEASE do not throw any waste in the wooded areas, this has been a problem in the past. Dispose of your waste in the appropriate containers.

19 Mile Rd. between 90th Ave. and 105th Ave. - Resurface 105th Ave. between 18 Mile and 19 Mile - Gravel 90th Ave. between 23 Mile and Meceola - Gravel We are waiting on estimates from MCRC and then the Board will make a final decision based on funding.

MITCHELL'S LANDING: Many longtime Chippewa Township residents remember Mitchell's Landing as the place they learned how to swim. Located at the end of 3rd St. just north of Millet Park. A proposed revitalization plan was submitted to EGLE and the Mecosta County Drain Commission by Chippewa Township and it was approved. Revitalization of the road end park has begun and the plan is to complete work in 2022. Features of the park include a sandy beach, concrete wheelchair accessible pathway to the lakeshore and grassy sitting area with benches viewing over our beautiful Chippewa Lake. The concrete pathway is designed to be used for multiple purposes but it is not a boat launch except for hand carried nonmotorized vessels such as kayak and canoes. In the winter it may be used to provide foot access for ice fishing and other winter lake activities. Mitchell's Landing Township Park is a swim at your own risk park but there will be swim buoys marking the properties borders and safe swimming areas. Vehicle parking is along Dwight St. in front of Millett Park.
