TREASURER REPORT:

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Two ladies were in attendance and questioned the flooding of a low-lying area in the road on Hahn Park Drive. It was explained to them that it is a private road and Chippewa Township has no jurisdiction over private roads.

LIBRARY REPORT:

The DNR is doing some investigating because although Chippewa Township has the paperwork that states the MCRC gave Chippewa Township that property, a deed was never recorded.

VERIZON TOWER UPDATE:

Verizon submitted a FOIA request asking multiple questions regarding the site for which the tower will be located. This means they are one step closer to installation!

SOLAR PANEL FARMS:

Consumers Energy contacted Supervisor, B.Roels and asked if Chippewa Township was in favor of Solar Panel Farms within our Township. **RESOLUTION B.Roels/A.Walters** to respond to Consumers Energy stating that Chippewa Township does not have a biased opinion to solar panel farms within Chippewa Township. **ROLL CALL VOTE: 2 ayes, 1 absent, 2 nays RESOLUTION FAILED**

C.L. WEED CONTROL:

PLM treated nuisance weeds on August 18th. They also treated 60 acres of Algae. B.Roels will turn in the last monitoring samples of the year on September 20, 2022.

C.L. SEWER DISTRICT:

Scott has 3 more systems to install this year, totally 9 new systems for 2022. The Michigan Rural Water Assessment went well and B.Roels should receive the paperwork soon.
